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
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New CD: Jascha Silberstein plays Servais

The cellist Jascha Silberstein (°1934) has had a long international carreer and he was soloist of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra in New York from 1966 to 1996.

'IaschaSilberstein.LivePerformances' is a series of compact discs with historic, previously unreleased recordings. Servais was already present with a composition on Volume 1 from 2001.

Recently volume 5 was released. Together with the famous violinist Aaron Rosand (see aaronrosand.com) Silberstein plays the 'Duo sur Les Huguenots' by Servais & Vieuxtemps and two times the second duo by Servais & Léonard. The recordings were made in 1970 in Indianapolis and in 1974 in Arnhem.

New: La double tragédie de Misia Sert

Father Alex-Ceslas Rzewuski (1892-1983) knew Misia Sert, Servais' granddaughter, very well and so he was a privileged witness to her marriage problems with José-Maria Sert, caused by princess Mdivani.

Half a century later Rzewuski wrote down his impressions. They are now published for the first time. This book is a useful addition to/correction of Misia's memoirs and the biography by Gold & Fizdale.

Servais in Helsinki

On May 15, 2006 something special happened: the performance of two compositions by Servais with orchestra. Nowadays Servais' music is usually played by duos and exceptionally with orchestra. The performance has been made possible thanks to Seeli Toivio, one of Finland's finest cellists and even famous in Japan. Together with the Uusinta Chamber Orchestra conducted by Eva Ollikainen she played in Helsinki Servais' opus 16, *La Fille du Régiment* and opus 17, *O Cara Memoria*. Both works were highly appreciated by the public. The Servais Society procured the orchestral parts for opus 16.

On June 6, 2007 Seeli Toivio will perform works by Servais in the Basilica in Halle and on November 9, 2007 in Antwerp.

Apart from giving concerts, Seeli Toivio is also a postgraduate student (Doctor of Music) at the Sibelius Academy Docmusdepartment in Helsinki since 2004. She is writing about the development of the left hand technique on the cello from the 18th century till the mid-twentieth century.

A few days after her concert in Helsinki she travelled to Belgium for research concerning Servais' contribution to the left hand technique. Together with Peter François, who accompanied her during her stay, she is also studying Servais' contribution to the development of cello technique in general.



Descendant of Servais on the scene

Indeed: there are still artists in the family. One of Servais' great great great grandsons is dancer-choreographer at the Opéra National de Paris and a great great grandson has a strong baritone voice. Charles-Emile Vanderlinden studied with Lea Apostel, Albrecht Klora (Düsseldorf), Jaume Aragall (Barcelona), Jean-Pierre Blivet (Paris) and Marcel Vanaud (Mons). He already participated in many recitals, operettas and operas.

For five years he did not appear in public but he made his comeback on the scene with his concert on March 17, 2006 in Sint-Lambrechts-Woluwe for some two hundred music lovers. On June 10 he sang at *L'Atelier de la Dolce Vita* in



Sint-Joost-ten-Node. Among others he performed two songs by Franz Liszt and the song 'Fleur Jetée' by Franz Servais (1846-1901), the oldest son of A.F. Servais.

On both concerts Anne Goffaux, teacher at the Conservatoire Royal de Bruxelles, accompanied him on the piano.

Festival Servais 2007

Servais' bicentennial is approaching. The Festival Servais 2007 already starts on November 26, 2006. The preparations of the concerts and the exhibitions are in full progress. Recently the Royal Flemish Filharmonic confirmed the performance in Antwerp of Servais' Concerto en Si mineur, opus 5, with Paul Watkins as a conductor and Seeli Toivio as a soloist. A lot of other news can be found on the Festival web site, which will be updated soon.
