Servais Concert on November 26, 2010

The repertory of the Finnish cello-player Seeli Toivio contains over fifteen works by the Halle composer Servais. She was our town's guest during the Servais Festival held in 2007. And on 26th November she is coming to Servais' native town once more, this time accompanied by two other Finnish ladies, violinist Linda Hedlund and harpist Lily-Marlene Puusepp. These three ladies have already given quite a number of international performances, while they have also undertaken numerous cd-performances. They will bring a selection from the romantic chamber music repertoire. Obviously, Servais will feature high on the programme, precisely on the 144th anniversary of his death.

Looking back

Servais Concert on June 5, 2010

Once again Halle was able to host a few top musicians for the ninth Servais Concert on 5th June 2010: Didier Poskin together with the Ensemble Rosamunde. Didier Poskin, a cello teacher at the Brussels Royal Conservatory, is a pre-eminent ambassador of Servais' music: indeed, for the past few years he has played work by the Halle cellist in some twenty places in Belgium and even in Luxembourg, Zilina (Slovakia) and Seoul. Together with the Ensemble Rosamunde he also produced the cd 'Souvenirs. François Servais', which was released at the beginning of this year and is entirely devoted to Servais, including the first recording of Souvenir d'Anvers and Souvenir de la Suisse. Needless to say, the Halle programme also featured work by Servais, more particularly his La Romanesca, Souvenir de la Suisse and Fantaisie sur Le Désir, as well as Schubert and Boccherini. The concert was a musical tribute to Servais on the eve of his 203rd birthday. A few members of the Servais Society had expressly come from France, the Netherlands and all (remote) places in this country to attend the concert. There were also a great many cellists in the concert hall, among whom Edmond Baert, a former teacher of Didier Poskin at the Brussels Conservatory. Another famous attendant was Poskin's former student Romain Dhainaut, who will be our guest together with pianist Pierre Brunello on the concert next spring (June 3, 2011).



Miscellaneous News

» On May 24, 2010 the famous German cello-player Walter **Grimmer** came to Halle, together with his former student Didier Poskin, who is now a professor himself at the Royal

Brussels Conservatory.

They paid a visit to the Servais exhibition and had a look at the Servais collection "backstage". Walter Grimmer was so kind as to donate five scores of Servais, which he had used himself before.



- » On July 1, Sarah Dupriez and Vincent Hepp gave a performance in the magnificent Sint-Laurentiuskerk in Antwerp. They played, for the very first time, the Grand Duo sur des motifs de l'Opéra Les Huguenots by Servais and Vieuxtemps.
- » During the summer months the seventh edition of the "Hortus Festival" was organized in the Netherlands, which this year focussed on Misia Sert, Servais' granddaughter. Consequently, the programme featured work of Ravel, Debussy, Poulenc, Stravinsky and contemporaries. The six concerts were repeated in Haren, Amsterdam, Leiden as well as Utrecht.

» Last August Didier Poskin travelled to South Korea to teach masterclasses and also to give a few concerts. The theme of one of the concerts, in the Ilshin Hall in Seoul, was "Chopin & Servais on Cello". This was an opportunity for the audience to discover Servais' Fantaisie sur le Désir and Souvenir de la Suisse.

- » From September 6 till 10, **Andrzej Pieńkos** was staying in Belgium to pursue his investigation into Cyprien Godebski (1835-1909), sculptor and Servais' son-in-law. Pieńkos is a professor of history of art at Warsaw University and head of the Art-historical Institute of the Polish capital. He also visited Halle, where Godebski had spent several years of his life, which of course has left some traces. In the first place we think of Servais' statue now in the centre of the "Grote Markt", as well as the sculptures that decorate the flight of steps of the ancient Town Hall, the bas-reliefs on the walls of the Villa Servais and Emile Possoz' medallion, which can be seen in the Museum. Finally, also in nearby Lembeek two of Godebski's works have been preserved. Professor Pieńkos had already visited Vienna, Paris, Brittany and Carrara before.
- » The permanent exhibition devoted to the Servais family at the "Zuidwestbrabants Museum" has recently been renovated.


Sarah Dupriez, the winner of the Servais Prize at the first Servais Cello Competition held in 2007, has been studying under Arto Noras in Hamburg since September 2010 to obtain the postgraduate 'Solist Diplom'. She will be an assistant teacher at the Royal Conservatory in Brussels.

» The third **Amsterdam Cello Biennale** will be taking place from November 5 till 14. Several thousands of cello lovers will assemble once more in the "Muziekgebouw" near the river IJ for concerts, masterclasses, lectures and competitions. Also the Servais Society will be present.

In the Showcase

Le Comte Ory reissued

The Italian publishing house Musedita is renowned for regularly publishing interesting compositions which have not been available for a long time. This mainly involves 17th and 18th century works, but every now and then an excursion is made into the 19th century as well.

So, in 2010 Musedita published a new edition of Servais'

Caprice sur des motifs de l'Opera Le Comte Ory de Rossini, in the version for two cellos, which had not been available for over a century. The editor drew on the first edition by Schott in 1848 and went about it very carefully. In addition, the reissue has been nicely set up, while the low price is very alluring: a mere 9 Euros for the score and the two parts. Worth the money and so a good incitement to get to know Servais' Opus 3.
