# Celebrating the tenth anniversary of the Servais Society

For ten years now the Servais Society has been promoting the study and propagation of the life and work of François Servais and his offspring. This was celebrated by the Society on November 23th with a festive Servais Concert, the presentation of a score and the opening of the digital Servais collection.

#### 15th Servais Concert

Cellists Viviane Spanoghe and Didier Poskin gave a highly appreciated concert to a full Council Chamber in the Halle Town Hall. Servais' 6 Etudes were performed again for the first time after years of oblivion, while there was also the Belgian première of Michel Lysight's 'Langton's Ants' performed by Didier Poskin in the presence of the composer himself. The programme also featured work by Vieuxtemps, Jongen, Huybrechts, Ysaye and Feldbusch. Music lovers from all over the country and even from Utrecht and Amsterdam


#### New honorary members

The Society has recently also adopted some new honorary members: Edmond Baert, Walter Grimmer and Didier Poskin. Seventy-nine-year old Edmond Baert was a cello teacher at the Brussels Conservatory for a long time, and so he was a remote successor to Servais. He was one of first to promote a renewed interest in Servais thanks to his numerous performances and a gramophone recording in the early 1980's. Walter Grimmer got acquainted with Servais' music in the 1950's as a student of Maurice Gendron in Paris and has been enthralled by it ever since. Didier Poskin got to know Servais through both these teachers and is now a docent at the Brussels Conservatory himself. He has already performed Servais' compositions on innumerable occasions and also recorded two CDs devoted to his oeuvre. # CD 'François Servais' – Smithsonian Chamber Players

In 2014 the Dutch cellist Anner Bijlsma celebrates his 80th birthday. Not only was Bijlsma touring all over the world giving concerts, he also managed to produce an impressive discography. Sony Musical Classical has now re-edited 36 recordings containing cello concertos, suites, sonatas and chamber




music. For a number of these recordings Bijlsma played on the Servais Stradivarius in the collection of the Smithsonian Institute in Washington. So he did for a record completely dedicated to Servais' music, which was recorded in 1986 and then released as a record and CD in 1988. Together with the Smithsonian Chamber players he performed the Souvenir de Spa and Souvenir de Bade, with Kenneth Slowik the Caprice on Rossini's Le Comte Ory and two of the Six Caprices, and together with Vera Beths the Duo sur deux airs anglais. The CD had been sold out for a long time but is now available again after a quarter of a century.

#### Liszt and his students Franz Servais, Jules Zarembski and Johanna Wenzel

In May 1881 Franz Liszt sat for a portrait with three of his students, Jules Zarembski, Johanna Wenzel and Franz Servais, François Servais' eldest son. Christo Lelie uses this iconic picture as a starting point for a long article in the periodical of the Franz Liszt Circle 2013. He sets the four artists and their mutual relationships in the appropriate context and also extensively focuses on their Halle connection; indeed, the four of them had been in Halle as well. The article is well documented and lavishly illustrated. Five of the pictures come from the Halle Servais Collection.
