#### 6 JUNE: SERVAIS' ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATED WITH START RESTAURATION VILLA SERVAIS

On 6 June 2017 the members of the Servais Society and the people who participated in the champagne sale gathered at the Villa Servais for the celebration of Servais' 210th anniversary. Geert De Poorter, the villa's new owner, welcomed the numerous public. Peter François told that Servais hasn't escaped notice during the last ten years. Linda Temminck explained how she operated in restoring the Rossini medallion and reconstructing the Meyerbeer medallion. Walter Wiertz, a Meyerbeer expert from Germany and Henry Vanderlinden, Servais' great-great-grandson, expressed their appreciation of the initiative. The alderman Marc Snoeck and the mayor Dirk Pieters spoke a few words in conclusion. Cellist Ann Van Hecke and the dansers of Project.C provided the intermezzos. Afterwards we touched glasses on Servais' health with the new Servais beer.

## SERVAIS SOCIETY TRAVELLED TO THE UKRAINE

The Servais Society is focusing strongly on the international promotion of Servais, especially in the cities he ever visited. Peter François travelled to the Ukraine at the invitation of the Ukraine Ambassy in Brussels. The ambassador Mykola Tochytskyi and his wife Tamara Tochytska have been very helpful.

In Lviv Peter François visited the former German Theatre and the Town hall, two places where the Halle cellist performed. He had a fruitful conversation with the rector and the vice-rector of the Musical Academy. Lubov Kyyanovska, a teacher of music history, explained that Servais was well-known and appreciated in the Ukraine and that his concerts left a deep impression to, among others, the most famous poet of the country Taras Shevchenko, who laudatory wrote about him. In 1860 the Musical Society of Galicia offered him a diploma of honour, a mark of honour only granted to the greatest musicians. In the library of that institution some fourty compositions by Servais are being conserved.



#### Musical Academy Lviv

In Kiev Peter François was being received warmly by the vice-rector professor Volodymyr A. Buhrov of the Taras Shevchenko National University. The 'Salle de l'Université' where Servais performed with much success, still exists. Servais also gave concerts in the 'Salle des contrats' which also still exists. Peter François had a special meeting with Alexander Piriyev, a cellist who already had played Servais 'Souvenir de Spa' in Kiev and who is very active as a concert organizer. He also had an interesting talk with the rector and a few teachers of the National Pedagogical Dragomanov University. In Kiev François also met Luc Jacobs, the Belgian ambassador in the Ukraine and Vladimir Sheiko, director of the National Radio Company of Ukraine and chief-conductor of the Ukrainian Radio Symphony Orchestra.

Finally in Zitomir he talked to Petro Datsenko, general director of the Philharmony of Zitomir, which is settled in the theatre where Servais possibly performed.

Both in Lviv and Kiev plans are ripening to get to work with Servais' music and in both cities one is interested in further investigation of Servais' presence.


