#### EXPO 'FRANCOIS SERVAIS, THE PAGANINI OF THE CELLO' (9-21 MAY)

François Servais (1807-1866) was a pioneering cellist, a European star and one of the founding fathers of the Belgian School of Cello Playing. He made music with Mendelssohn, Rossini and Vieuxtemps and was rated highly by Schumann, Meyerbeer and Berlioz. One and a half century after his death his virtuoso cello compositions still resound all over the world.


Come and discover his life and work at the exposition in the entrance hall of Flagey during the Queen Elisabeth International Cello Competition.



From 13 to 16 April 2022, the fourth 'Four days with Servais' took place in Halle. The four cellists of the Tansman Cello Quartet -Marinela Doko, Fernando Lima, Didier Poskin and Karel Steylaerts - once again resided in Halle, this time together with Ann Van Hecke. During the 27th Servais Concert on April 13,

The five cellists also gave a four-day internship to 27 cellists from Belgium and France at the Campus Servais of the Halle Kunstacademie. The participants got masterclasses and also had the unique opportunity to play in a cello ensemble. In addition, they were immersed in the history of Servais and his hometown, Halle.

### LOOKING BACK: 'FOUR DAYS WITH SERVAIS' (13-16 April 2022)






During the closing concert on April 16, they showed the result of four days of hard work. The four chamber music groups performed one by one with work by Haydn, Schubert, Dvorak and Schäffer. As an apotheosis, all cellists appeared on stage together with three works for cello orchestra. One of these was La Romanesca by François Servais, in a beautiful

adaptation by Fernando Lima. As a closing sound I'm in another world by Duke Ellington. The four-day event was a unique experience for the cellists and an opportunity for the public to discover the cello in various facets.
